


V1 NC It's a **C** beautiful day in this **A7** neighborhood




A **Dm** beautiful day for a **G7** neighbor

V2 It's a **C** neighborly day in this **A7** beautywood




A **Dm** neighborly day for a **G7** beauty

Bridge


I have **F** always wanted to **A7** have a neighbor **Dm** just like **B7** you




I've **C** always wanted to **Dm** live in a neighbor-**B7** hood with **G7/** you,

V3 NC So, **C** let's make the most of this **A7** beautiful day (pause)




Dm Since we're together, we **G7** might as well say (pause)




C Would you be mine? **Dm** Could you be mine?

G7 Won't you be my **C** neighbor?




Tag

Bracketed chords are 4 counts **[Em7]**

Non-bracketed chords are 2 counts **Em7**

Non-bracketed chord with a slash is a single strum **Em7/**
